Operational User Groups go on a field trip

Members from the Prince of Wales Hospital Medical Imaging operational user group visited the new Westmead Central Acute Services Building.

The aim of this field trip was to observe how the teams have commenced operational commissioning and to gather an understanding of the newly developed ways of working that Westmead will adopt once the building opens for service. Clinicians and the Westmead Redevelopment team shared lessons learnt from their move into the new facility.

This was a great opportunity for the Medical Imaging department to assess how they can prepare for commissioning and identify areas that they will need to focus on during the transition to the Prince of Wales Hospital Integrated Acute Services Building.

Delivery of the Integrated Acute Services Building is well underway

Concrete pouring and finishing work to establish each level of the new building is well underway. Over 25,000m³ of concrete will be poured including 155 major pours during delivery of the new building. The top floor, which includes a new helipad, is expected to be reached in early 2021.

Currently visible from outside the site compound are the three main concrete structures that form the structural core, fire escapes, stairwells and passenger lifts. As building works progress each level will be enclosed with exterior panelling and glass forming the façade.



Largest concrete pour on site

On June 24 the largest concrete pour for the IASB was carried out. This concrete pour covered a total of 1400sqm and included 550 cubic meters of concrete. 92 concrete truck deliveries supported the activity.



Hospital Road lowering update

To enable development of the Integrated Acute Services Building and future-proof the Sydney Children's Hospital, Randwick Stage 1 redevelopment, Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre and development of UNSW Sydney's Health Translation Hub, works on Hospital Road are required. During the month of July piling and bulk excavation work will commence to support the lowering of Hospital Road and will require temporary closures of Delivery Drive. Hospital Campus car park

and Francis Martin
Drive access will be
maintained from
Barker Street during
this time. Hospital
Road remains closed
to through-access for
vehicles, pedestrians
and bicycles.

Sarah lives in Wollongong. Her commute includes a train from North Wollongong to Redfern Station. She then rides her bike from Redfern to work at Sydney Children's Hospital.

She leaves her bike in the Redfern Station Bike Shed overnight. In total Sarah's commute is 1 hour and 40 minutes (20 minute cycle). She really enjoys the benefits of the cycling part of her trip by getting daily exercise and avoiding crowded buses or waiting for trams.

"The way in is fairly uphill so I purchased a better bike, discovering the free bike shed at Redfern station using opal card means I don't have to try and get my bike on a very crowded south coast train in the afternoon."
