Planning progresses

Building a new hospital building takes many years. Expected to open in 2022, the new Acute Services Building will link into the heart of the four hospitals located at Randwick and to future buildings accommodating health-related education, training and research activities on campus.

Where are we up to?

Concept Design for the Acute Services Building was completed in June 2017 providing early information on the location of the new building and how it will share services with the current hospitals.

Schematic Design, which looks at how rooms and services within individual wards and departments relate to each other and how services 'flow' between new and existing infrastructure, is currently underway and is expected to be finalised in early 2018.

Planning assessment

A State Significant Development Application for the Acute Services Building will be lodged with NSW Department of Planning and Environment in 2018. As a part of the assessment process, an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) will be published for community consultation.

Drop-in community information sessions will be held and you will be able to ask questions of the project team and provide feedback on the proposal.

The EIS will outline the proposal and provide the outcomes of the investigations into:

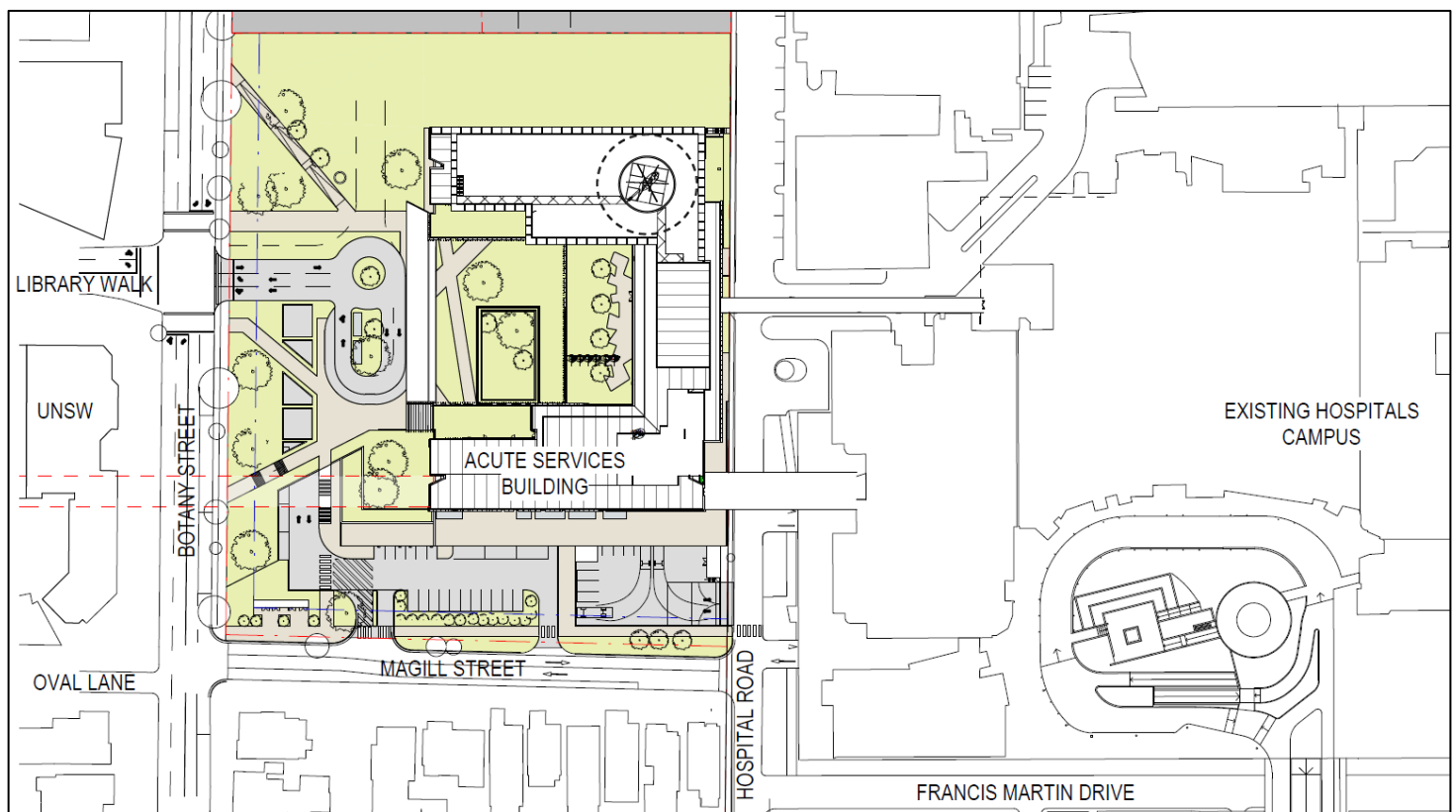
- Traffic and access
- Amenity
- Structural and civil engineering
- Air space considerations
- Building code and disability access
- Noise, dust, vibration, construction management
- Other environmental considerations.

What facilities will be in the new Acute Service Building?

- An adult new emergency department, intensive care unit and medical assessment unit
- Extra beds and contemporary patient facilities
- New operating theatres for the campus
- Helipad, ambulance bays, loading dock and ED access and drop-off
- Multiple connections back into the Randwick Hospitals' Campus including a pedestrian bridge over Hospital Road and another multilevel bridge for internal patient movements and logistics
- Integrated education, training and research facilities and new retail spaces
- A new Hospital square with vehicle access from Botany Street and public drop-off area
- Upgraded road infrastructure at Magill Street and Botany Street
- Building services infrastructure and connections to utilities
- Stormwater drainage infrastructure including on-site detention
- Landscaping and outdoor areas.
