



Construction Update

The Randwick Campus Redevelopment project incorporates the Prince of Wales Hospital (POWH) Acute Services Building (ASB) and associated UNSW Eastern Extension, along with the future Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre (SCH1/MCCCC) building, and UNSW's Health Translation Hub (HTH).

During June, the project celebrated a key milestone with the official opening of the new Acute Services Building (ASB) marking a significant chapter in POWH's 160-year history of caring for the local community. The future SCH1/MCCCC building is beginning to take shape and emerge from the ground, alongside commencement of works on the UNSW HTH site.

Upcoming activities

Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building

With completion of the first stage of major construction activities, the ASB is now home to major hospital services including the Emergency Department and Intensive Care Unit.

Ongoing works include activities within the main entrance forecourt to complete the project's arts and culture components, along with internal fit-out works for additional inpatient units, which will continue throughout the year.

Works to install directional signage to support navigation to the new ASB and Emergency Department continues on roadways surrounding the hospital campus, with some night works required.

UNSW Eastern Extension

A 5,000 square metre extension to the ASB will be home to UNSW research, clinical innovation, biomedical and teaching facilities across 10 floors to enable students to work side by side with clinicians.

With main construction now complete, internal fit-out works within the space will soon commence, continuing throughout the year in preparation for the facility becoming operational in 2024.

Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre

Excavation, inground service installations and building foundation works for the SCH1/MCCCC building are nearing completion, as construction of

the basement and suspended concrete slabs continues.

Works for the core structural elements, including stairwells and lift shafts, continue into July, alongside installation of a rotating truck turntable to support efficient movement of construction vehicles within the site.

Works to install a protective gantry hoarding at the corner of High Street and Hospital Road are scheduled to occur in coming months, weather permitting. These works may generate intermittent construction noise. Detailed information will be provided to nearby stakeholders ahead of works.

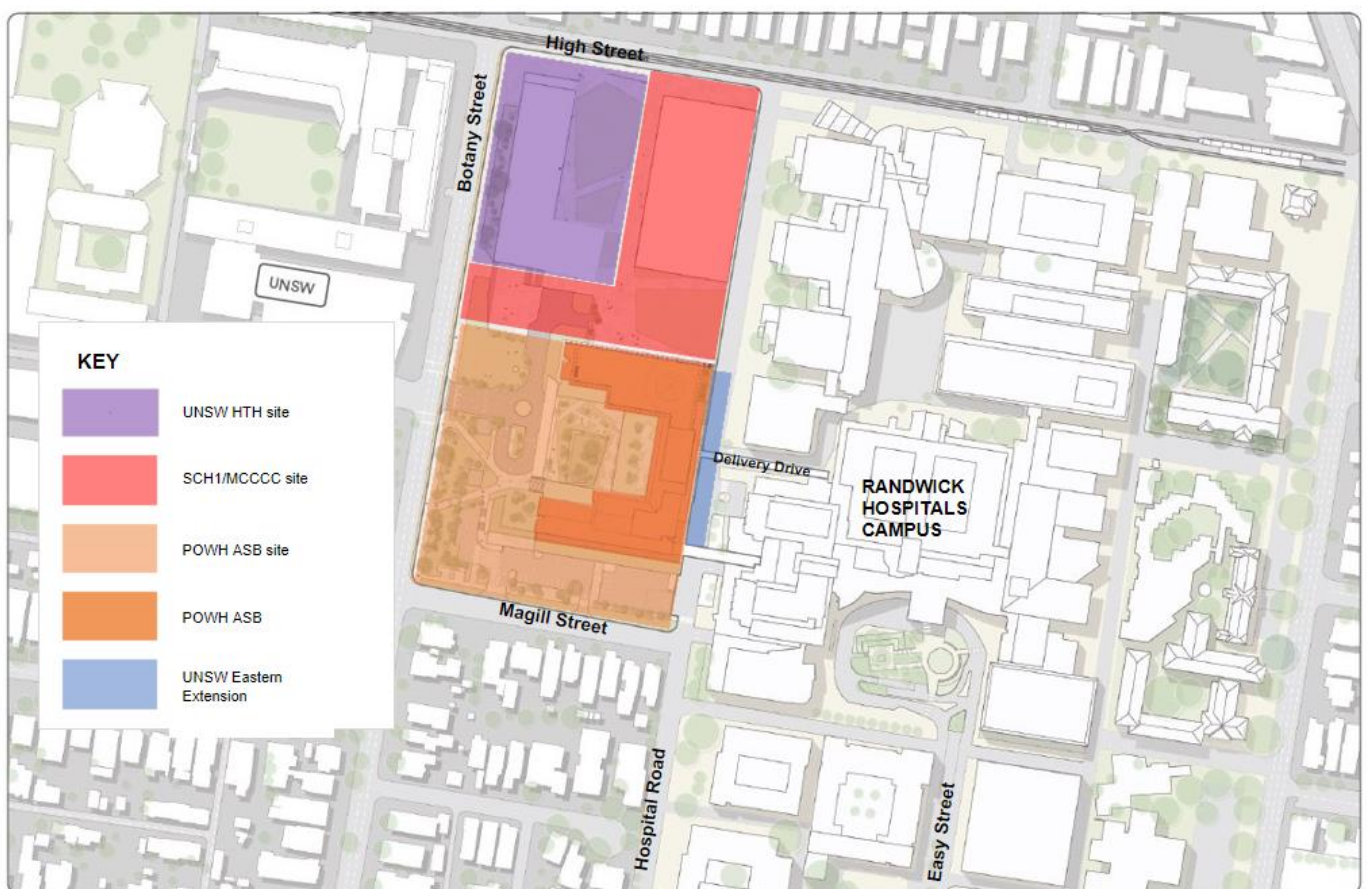
UNSW Health Translation Hub

UNSW's construction partner, Hansen Yuncken, has commenced activities within the UNSW HTH site.

Site establishment activities include the setup of site sheds and storage compounds, alongside intermittent out of hours deliveries of large equipment to support piling and bulk excavation works.

A construction loading zone will soon be established on Botany Street to assist with the delivery and removal of materials effectively and safely within the HTH site and the broader Randwick Campus Redevelopment construction zone.
