

Construction Update

The Randwick Campus Redevelopment project incorporates the Prince of Wales Hospital (POWH) Acute Services Building (ASB) and associated UNSW Eastern Extension, along with the future Sydney Children’s Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children’s Comprehensive Cancer Centre (SCH1/MCCCC) building, and UNSW’s Health Translation Hub (HTH).

Upcoming activities

Sydney Children’s Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children’s Comprehensive Cancer Centre

Foundation works for the new hospital are now complete, including excavation and inground service installation.

Works on the core structural elements continue, including stairwells and lift shafts alongside staged concrete pours of the suspended slabs.

The project recently celebrated the naming of the two tower cranes supporting delivery of the future SCH1/MCCCC building – named by two children the new hospital will support, the cranes are now fondly known as 'Jupiter' and 'Andy'.

Approved out of hours activity is planned in August to enable the delivery of construction materials and equipment. These works may result in minor noise impacts from vehicles entering and exiting the site, and the unloading of equipment.

Out of hours activities to install a protective overhead gantry hoarding at the corner of High Street and Hospital Road are scheduled to occur in August, weather permitting. These works may generate intermittent construction noise. Detailed information will be provided to nearby stakeholders ahead of activities commencing.

Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building

Work for the project’s arts and culture components is nearing completion, with remaining activities focused within Level 0 of the main entrance foyer.

Other construction activities within the recently opened building include internal fit-out works for additional inpatient units, which will continue throughout the year.



UNSW Health Translation Hub

Construction activity is well underway within the UNSW HTH site, with piling and bulk excavation continuing into August.

A construction loading zone has been established along the Botany Street perimeter, which will also support the future installation of a protective overhead gantry hoarding above the Botany Street footpath.

In addition to early hours activity to deliver construction machinery and equipment in early August, further out of hours site activity is planned in late August (weather permitting) to install the first of three tower cranes that will support ongoing construction of the HTH.

As part of this activity, a weekend road closure will be required to enable delivery of the tower crane via the Botany Street construction gate. Detailed information

will be provided to nearby stakeholders ahead of works commencing. The second tower crane is planned to be installed during September.

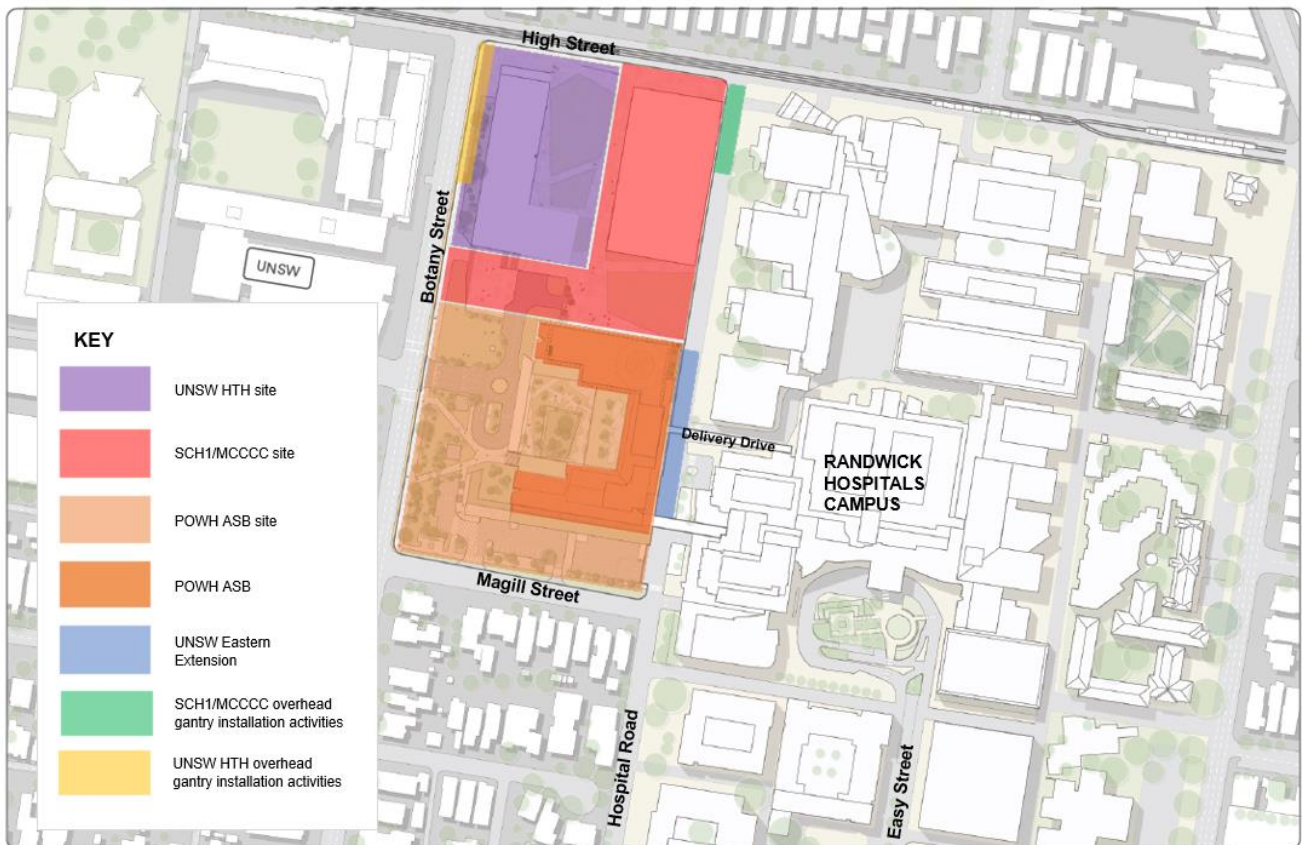
UNSW Eastern Extension

As all activities for the UNSW Eastern Extension are within the newly opened and operational Acute Services Building, the project team plans collaboratively with stakeholders to ensure the hospital campus can continue operating throughout activity, with strict measures in place to manage construction impacts.

Internal fit-out works are planned to commence in August, continuing for the rest of the year.

Initial activity will be focused on partitioning and services installation, including drainage systems for the new facility.

Managing construction activities

Out of hours work will continue to be communicated directly to affected stakeholders. All activity dates and times are subject to change.
