## Randwick Campus Redevelopment

April 2025



## Construction Update

Construction continues on the Randwick Campus Redevelopment site to deliver the Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre (SCH1/MCCCC) project and adjacent UNSW Health Translation Hub (HTH), alongside ongoing internal works within the Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building (ASB) and refurbishment activities in previously vacated hospital spaces.

## Upcoming activities

### Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building and broader campus

Internal fit-out works within Level 1 of the ASB are ongoing, including wall, ceiling and flooring installations. Associated works within the building's main entrance foyer mezzanine will continue during April, with a temporary construction zone in place to support these works until completion.

Refurbishment works within previously vacated Prince of Wales Hospital spaces also continue. Mitigation measures are in place to minimise construction impacts and support the continuity of hospital operations during the works.



### Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre

Internal fit-out works and service installations are progressing across all levels of the 12-storey building.

External landscaping of terraces and public domain spaces also continues, alongside construction of the much-anticipated playground feature of the project.

Works to complete the future High Street entrance forecourt will require intermittent pedestrian and vehicle diversions during April. Measures will be in place to minimise noise and access disruptions as much as possible.

Construction-related activities within the southern footpath on High Street will also continue, with pedestrians intermittently redirected to the northern footpath for safety.

### UNSW Health Translation Hub

Works on the building's public domain space, including landscaping, external pavements and awning installation, are progressing.

Waterproofing works on the rooftop have commenced and will continue throughout April, alongside terrace works, site servicing, infill structural elements and ongoing internal fit-out.

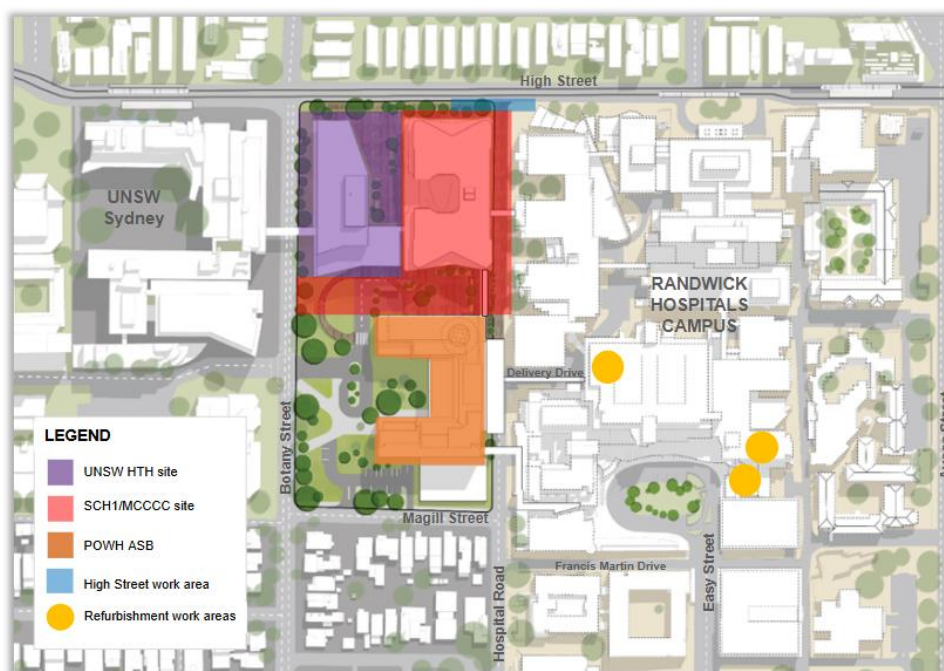
Pedestrian diversions to the western footpath of Botany Street will be in place intermittently during April to enable overhead hoarding removal.

### Managing construction activities

We are committed to minimising the impact of our works. All construction activities are carried out with the health and safety of the local community and site workers as our top priority, and we endeavour to keep noise, dust and vibration to a minimum. Where possible, activities are scheduled during approved site hours of **Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm and Saturday, 8am to 5pm**. Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Out of hours work will be communicated directly to affected stakeholders, with all activity dates and times remaining subject to change. Inaudible concrete finishing and other works may extend beyond 6pm where necessary, in line with planning conditions. Delivery of construction materials and equipment may also be undertaken out of hours where required by law due to vehicle size. Please note that service upgrades unrelated to the project may also be undertaken by other agencies at any time without notification.
